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Don't forget your shots!

Reminder to Parents: Infants should start their immunizations by two months of age. Immunizations prevent your child from becoming seriously ill, and many are required for daycare, preschool and K through 12 school entrance by the State of Wisconsin.

Be sure to keep your records up-to-date.

Immunizations Available

DTaP.....Diphtheria, Tetanus, Acellular Pertussis
HPV.....Human Papillomavirus
Hep A.....Hepatitis A
Hib.....Haemophilus influenzae B
IPV.....Injectable Polio Vaccine
PCV13.....Pneumococcal
Hep B.....Hepatitis B (available to 18 yrs & younger)
RV.....Rotavirus (2-8 months)
Flu.....6 months through 18 years
MMR.....Measles, Mumps, Rubella
VZV.....Varicella Vaccine (Chickenpox) (available to 18 yrs & younger)
MCV4.....Meningococcal Vaccine (Adolescents)
Tdap.....Tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis (Adolescents & Adults)
Td.....Tetanus, diphtheria

Adult Immunizations: Tetanus & Diphtheria (Td); Tetanus, Diphtheria, Acellular Pertussis (Tdap) if never immunized, a 3 shot series is needed; second and third shots given 2 and 8 months, respectively, after the first; with a booster dose every 10 years. **MMR** requires just one dose for adults born after 1957. A second dose is recommended for college students and health care workers.

The following adult immunizations may be obtained from your physician or other provider:

Influenza (Flu) annually (Sept-Feb)-**Pneumococcal pneumonia**-usually one shot at 65 or older of PCV13 followed by the pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccine (PPSV23). **Hepatitis A**-2 shot series; **Hepatitis B**-3 shot series; **Varicella (chickenpox vaccine)** 2 shot series; **Shingles (Herpes Zoster)** one shot at 60 years or older; **Human Papillomavirus (HPV)** 3 shot series up to age 26 years.

Travel Shots-we can provide information on recommended vaccines when traveling outside the country to City of Appleton residents, or you can access this information on the Internet at home or at the public library at <http://www.cdc.gov/travel>. Many of the travel immunizations must be given by your physician.
