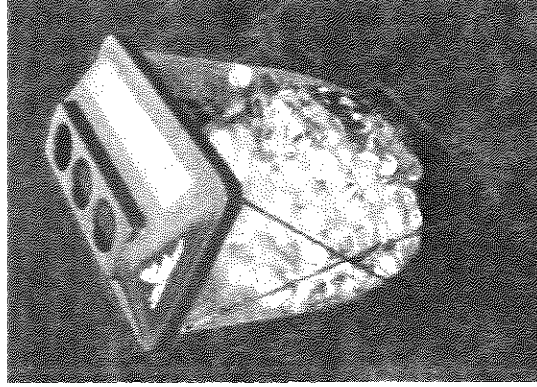

WHY RECYCLE AT SPECIAL EVENTS?

- ◆ It's the Law! Wisconsin requires everyone to recycle at home, work and special events
- ◆ People expect to recycle
- ◆ Reduces trash
- ◆ Potential cost savings on garbage
- ◆ Shows consideration for community
- ◆ Sets a good example for children
- ◆ "Go-Green" at your event
- ◆ Conserves resources
- ◆ Keep your event area cleaner

SPECIAL EVENTS

For most people, special events are a lot of fun, but for event organizers, they are a lot of work! A well-planned event requires cooperation, coordination, dedication, and attention to details. One important detail is managing all the trash and recyclables that a special event generates.

STATE LAW

Wisconsin's Recycling Law requires everyone in the state to recycle whether they are at home, at work, or at a special event.

Special events must provide recycling of:

- ◆ Glass Bottles and Jars
- ◆ Aluminum and Steel/Tin Cans
- ◆ Plastic Containers (#1 & #2)
- ◆ Newspapers
- ◆ Corrugated Cardboard
- ◆ Office Paper
- ◆ Other Items Depending on Community

HELPFUL HINTS

- ◆ **ALWAYS** place ClearStream Bin beside a trash container.
- ◆ Train workers how to properly secure bags and attach lids to the frame
- ◆ Make sure volunteers are collecting and replacing bags when they are **2/3 full**.
- ◆ Be aware of heavy traffic areas and move units to those areas.
- ◆ "Seed" or put a few recyclables in each container before the event starts

How to get started:

- ◆ Contact Outagamie County Solid Waste
- ◆ Complete the reservation form
- ◆ Outagamie County will help event planners determine number of bins & bags needed and develop a plan for setup, servicing bins and transporting recyclables.

Fees:

- ◆ Bins are reserved by refundable deposit
- ◆ \$.40/bag for special-sized clear plastic bags
- ◆ No additional fee for disposal of recyclables if brought to Outagamie County Solid Waste.

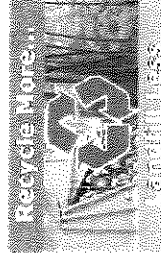
