- Allows you to be part of the statewide rising tide for active communities



- The zip codes where people live should not determine their health outcomes or opportunities to make healthy choices.
- Providing safe places to walk, bike and be active must be for EVERYONE regardless of socioeconomic status, race/ethnicity, rurality, immigration status, age or disability status.


