WHEREAS, Anthony "Tony" Awofeso, former R&D Manager at Georgia-Pacific in Oshkosh was a Co-Founder and the first President of African Heritage, Inc., hereto referred to as "AHI" formed in 1998 by a group of individuals of African descent who reside in the Fox Cities; and

**WHEREAS**, AHI provides a support system for Africans, African-Americans, and all in our community who have an interest in African American/Black culture and issues focused on the generation of goodwill and the promotion of cross cultural understanding and education which created the 1<sup>st</sup> Black History Month Program event in 1999 and the first Juneteenth Celebration ten years later in 2009; and

**WHEREAS**, he served as Chair of the Towards Community non-profit (the pre-cursor group to Celebrate Diversity Fox Cities); and

WHEREAS, he served as the first person of color to be elected into public office in Northeast Wisconsin as Outagamie County Board Supervisor in 2002 serving until 2008; then became President and Chair of the Board of Directors for B.A.B.E.S. Ministry and recipient of the annual Jane LaChapelle McCarty Community Leader Award at the 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Celebration in 2016; and

WHEREAS, he is the Former Board Member and Vice Chair of the Wisconsin Fair Housing Council and Board Member of CAP Services as well as a member of the African American Advisory Board to the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, Shirley Awofeso was a Co-Founder, Treasurer and Board Member of African Heritage, Inc. who started and coordinated the AHI care package program for Black students; and

WHEREAS, she led the purchase of school supplies for AHI's back to school program; and

WHEREAS, Shirley and Tony served as Co-Collaborators helping to provide the research for the "Stone of Hope Exhibit: Black Experiences in the Fox Cities from the 1700's to the present" at the History Museum at the Castle; and

WHEREAS, together they served 31 years in this community, including volunteering at McKinley and Houdini Schools after which they have now earned their right to begin their retirement with a legacy of multiple accomplishments leaving Appleton better than they found it;
